Potential Impact Discussions:

Field Review: 10/29/2021

Existing Site Conditions: The parcel is located on NH Route 302 with the Ammonoosuc River running parallel to Route 302. The Parcel is a grass field to the northeast and raspberry bushes along with white pine, sumac trees, and a few apple trees to the southwest. The parcel is accessible from Route 302.

A review of desktop resources determined that the site is within a source water protection area, farmland of local importance, and within a quarter of a mile to a designated river (Ammonoosuc River), no other valued resources from above were present. A NH Natural Heritage Bureau Landowner Request database review was conducted (NHB File ID# 3772) and found no known occurrence onsite of state or federally listed species.

A cultural review was completed by the NHDOT's Cultural Resource Program and they have made a determination that there will be no potential to cause effect to above ground or below ground resources. (See attached Cultural Review).

Contamination Review:

According to NHDES OneStop the parcel is not associated with a remediation site, therefore there are no contamination concerns from a point-source perspective, however statewide analytical data collected by NHDOT, as well as nationwide information, indicates that roadside soils commonly contain metals and Polycyclic Aromatic Hydrocarbons (PAHs) at concentrations above background conditions. These "Limited Reuse Soils" (LRS) when excavated shall be addressed in accordance with applicable NHDES rules.




We have searched our database for records of rare species and exemplary natural communities on the property(s) identified in your request. Our database includes known records for species officially listed as Threatened or Endangered by either the state of New Hampshire or the federal government, as well as species and natural communities judged by experts to be at risk in New Hampshire but not yet formally listed.

NHB records on the property(s): **None**

NHB records within one mile of the property(s): None

A negative result (no record in our database) does not mean that no rare species are present. Our data can only tell you of known occurrences, based on information gathered by qualified biologists and reported to our office. However, many areas have never been surveyed, or have only been surveyed for certain species. An on-site survey would provide better information on what species and communities are indeed present.

NOTE: This review *cannot* be used to satisfy a permit or other regulatory requirement to check for rare species or habitats that could be affected by a proposed project, since it provides detailed information only for records actually on the property.





Surplus Land – NHDOT Cultural Resources Review

For the purpose of compliance with regulations of the National Historic Preservation Act, the Advisory Council on Historic Preservation's *Procedures for the Protection of Historic Properties* (36 CFR 800), the US Army Corps of Engineers' *Appendix C*, and/or state regulation RSA 227-C:9, *Directive for Cooperation in the Protection of Historic Resources*, the NHDOT Cultural Resources Program has reviewed the proposed Surplus Land Application for potential impacts to historic properties.

Proposed Project: The Department received a request from Anson Hastings, who wishes to acquire a parcel of state-owned land (1.15 acres) abutting his property. The parcel, located at 2633 Littleton Rd/NHRT 10/302 in Lisbon, was purchased in 2000 for the RT 102 widening (Lisbon RF-033-1(8), 13252; abutting Lisbon Tax Map R29, Lot 10).





Although there is a structure on a neighboring parcel to the west, **the proposed surplus parcel is vacant.**


1978 Plans of Proposed Federal Aid Preliminary Project RF NH Project No. P-2170, RTs 10 B 302 depict a field, with a Vegetable garden in the SW corner of the parcel.


The EMMIT MAP review on 11/8/2021 revealed no historic districts or project areas are associated with the parcel, although an individual inventory form (LIS0001) was compiled for the Houston House. The inventory (M. Bowers 8/1/1999) described a single dwelling that also contained a wagon shed/garage off the SW corner of the house. The structure on the north side of Rt 302 was originally constructed c.1880 (as per visual est. and deed information), and the interior was renovated c.1950s. The property also contained a shed, wagon or carriage house. The inventory noted the lot has a 385 ft frontage on the highway, but is barely 100 ft deep, backing onto the steeply-sloping forested land at the base of Walker Hill.

The property was determined not eligible for the National Register (9/8/1999).

By 1999, the property appeared to have been unoccupied for some time.

David Trubey (4/4/2016) noted property loss was observed on Google Earth, while obtaining GIS coordinates.



Andrea Ohl and Victoria Bunker undertook *an Archeological Reconnaissance Survey Route 302 Bath to Lisbon* (1991), although this location lies north of the corridor reviewed.

Nevertheless, Native American sensitivity would have been impacted by the construction of the 19th century structures close to the road and the barely 100 ft deep lot, backing onto the steeply-sloping forested land at the base of Walker Hill. The archaeological sensitivity of the lot is also diminished by road and road shoulder construction, grading and removal of vegetation. There is no evidence of stonewalls, foundations, or burial grounds.
